

(Belgium, various places, 1850's). Approximately 320 chromolithographed cartes porcelaine, various sizes 80 x 45 mm to 360 x 275 mm, majority ca 132 x 84 mm variously mounted on 54 sheets of paper in various colours (white, grey, ocre, brown and yellow). 14 blank leaves. Cont. red morocco,



flat spine richly gilt. Covers with gilt and blind stamped floral decoration, front cover with gilt title 'Album'. Inner gilt dentelles. All edges gilt. Oblong folio (310 x 456 mm). Minor edgewear. A sumptuous binding. EURO 6.000.-

Rickards, Encyclopedia of Ephemera p. 183. Twyman, History of Chromolithography pp. 422-424. A magnificent and highly varied collection of chromolithographed and embossed trade cards, some with iridescent printing, but also including examples of menus, invitations, 44 cards with views of Belgian towns and other ephemera. All beautifully printed in colours on cards with a coated surface consisting of white lead which gives them a sheen after pressing them with strong steel cylinders and also providing a perfectly smooth printing surface. "Lithographed 'cartes porcelaine' were produced by one of two methods: Either by selectively dusting powdered colours and metals onto a single impression (or on the stone itself) to produce a range of colours, or by printing from several stones in succession, each inke in a different colour. Cards produced by the first method normaly feature lithographically engraved lettering and calligraphic flourishes and inevitably differ slightly from one to another,



in their colouring; those adopting the second approach usually include some solid areas of colour. Some of the finest of these cards show elements of both methods, and nearly all include parts in gold or silver, either as separate printings or in dusted form" (Twyman p. 423). The dates of these cards can not be exactly established with the extremely rare exception of copies with a printed date on them, but most of them were printed in the 1840s and 1850s when the fashion for cartes porcelaine was at its peak. Our album with the majority of the cards from Belgium but also including examples of French and German trade cards. A number of mounts with tears, or minor defects, due to the removal of only a few cards. A magnificently bound album with contents in fine condition.



Ron. Bibliotheca Tinctoria 0602. Probably first edition of this abridged pirated version of Hegemann's "Färbebuch für den häuslichen Gebrauch ..." published 1809 in Herborn with 272 pages. A second title-leaf with variant wording bound in: "Faerbebuch für den haeuslichen Gebrauch, oder Anleitung wie man Wolle, Leinwand, Seide und andere Zeuge selbst faerben und appretiren kann. Neue mit einem Anhang vermehrte Auflage. Reutlingen, bey Jakob Ulrich Maecken Comp. 1810". The first title in the work blurs the references to the original text by changing the wording. Maecken was infamous for his pirated editions of other publisher's works. An early 19th century German handbook, especially aimed at housewifes on domestic dyeing and printing.





First edition. End-papers lightly foxed. An astonishingly rare book on the market and with only 3 copies in German libraries. A nice copy without the usual traces of usage for such a book. A "Kunst-Buch" especially designed and compiled for professional artists and craftsmen from a wide range of fields.



A rare book on lacquer-work, including numerous formulas for the manufacture of colours. Several pages with browned water-stain. A very scarce manual with only a handful of copies in German institutional holdings.

Champfleury. Histoire de l'imagerie populaire pp. 185-186; Barbier III, 315; ESTC 173326; not in Nisard. Histoire des livres populaires. First edition of this compilation of nine pieces of buffoonish verses about the misery of apprentices, clercs and servants, including la Misère papetiers-colleurs, des apprentifs relieurs et doreurs de livres ; la Misère des apprentifs-imprimeurs, appliqué par le détail à chaque fonction de ce noble art ; la Misère des garcons boulangers de la ville et fauxbourgs de Paris ; and la Misère des garcons chirurgiens among others. "Chacun de ces livrets décline les mêmes motifs: Le caractère servile de l'apprentissage, les mauvais traitements,

l'infuffisance de nourriture et la médiocrité du gîte" (La Bibliothèque bleue & les Litératures de Colportage (2000), pp. 104-105).

Published by the printer-bookseller Cailleau, this compilation unites the 18th century folk tale "L'Histoire du bon homme Misère" (cf. Nisard I, p. 484) with nine other pieces, of which "La Misère des apprentifs-imprimeurs ..." could be ascribed to a certain Dufrène according to Barbier p. 315 (for a 1745 edition of this piece) "Il y a dit l'abbé de Saint-Léger, des choses assez plaisantes dans ces vers et des détails pratiques heureusement rendus. Jamet le jeune a marqué sur la première pages de son exemplaire que ce badinage est d'un nommé Dufrène, prote du fameux Léonhard, obligés l'un et l'autre de s'expatrier pour prévarication contre le gouvernement. Ce Dufrène est mort en 1748, Léonhard mourut à Londres, où il s'était réfugié". - A fine copy of a rare book, text of the first piece printed on blueish paper.

An alphabetical listing of 32 branches of business, each branch covers names of craft enterprises based in Nuremberg, illustrated with approximately one thousand mounted trade cards, various sizes (60 x 82 mm; 40 x 50 mm; 130 x 120 mm), engraved and lithographed on variously coloured paper stock, quite often printed in colours, a number of them handcoloured, and including 10 paper specimens with watermarks of paper manufacturers; sections contain mostly name of owners, and including in some instances more detailed descriptions of proprietary relationships on 164

contemporarily numbered leaves of which 27 blank, with a complete index of contents on leaf 161 recto and verso. Cont. half calf over brown paste paper boards. Front cover with oval paper shield with manuscript title. Folio (360 \times 210 mm). Spine and corners



restored, covers rubbed. EURO 9.750.-

Cf. Rickards. Encyclopedia Ephemera pp. 334-336 (for the history of trade cards). A fascinating overview on the craft enterprises based in Nuremberg in the beginning of the 19th century, not including publishing and allied trades. The most outstanding feature of this manuscript are undoubtedly the of astonishing number approximately thousand one illustrated trade cards and labels of the various craft enterprises pasted onto recto and verso of paper mounts. Most of them bear highly illustrative designs, with figurative and/or emblematical illustrations,

others showing tools and commodities. The majority are engravings printed in sanguine, blue, red or yellow, some of them handcoloured; a larger number of lithographs are included especially in the section on the tobacco manufacturers, printed in various techniques, some of them handcoloured and there are also a few stamped trademarks included. The section devoted to papermakers includes 10 different paper samples with watermarks of paper manufacturers.

The following professions and enterprises are represented: Ahlenschmiede; Brillenmacher; Bürstenbinder; Farbenfabrikanten; Feilenhauermeister; Geschmeidmacher*; Gold- und Silberdrahtfabrikanten; Goldhändler; Goldschlager; Goldspinner; Heftleinmacher; Kammacher; Kartätschenmacher; Lebküchner; Metalschlager; Messingfabriken; Nadelfabriken; Nadler und Fischangelmacher; Nagelschmiede*; Papierfabrikanten;

Rothschmiede; Saifensieder*; Scheibenzieher; Schellenmacher; Siegellackfabrikanten; Tabaksfabriken; Trompetenmacher; Zeugschmiede (Nebenschmiede); Zinngiesser*; Zirkelschmiede*. (= awlsmiths; eyewear manufacturers; brush binders; paint manufacturers; file cutters; jewellery makers; gold- and silver-thread makers; gold traders; gold beaters; gold thread spinning mills; staple linen manufacturers; comb producers; cartridge manufacturers; gingerbread manufacturers; metal beaters; brass factories; needle factories; needle and fishing rod makers; nail smiths; paper manufacturers; redsmiths; soap boilers; bell makers; seal wax manufacturers; tobacco factories; trumpet makers; coarse forgings; tinsmiths; forge shops). Sections marked with (*) do not have any mounted trade labels or other illustrations, just a list of business names.

Another peculiarity of this manuscript is the immensely dominant position of companies from the tobacco industry, which in itself covers sheets 87 to 131, while, for example, only one trumpet maker is listed. A treasure trove of cultural and economical first hand information on Nuremberg as a southern German business hub in the first half of the 19th century, represented in printed pictorial publicity, and with manuscript material offering first hand knowledge on ownership. - A few leaves with traces of minor dust- and finger-soiling.

Not in Internationale Bibliographie zur Papiergeschichte. A very nice and voluminous catalogue with paper sample specimens some of them with quite fancy Art déco decorations and illustrations. I could not find any hint regarding the trademark FK but I am convinced that this catalagoue was issued by a German manufacturer.



A fine French manuscript book of secrets or 'Kunstbuch' written in black ink in an easily legible hand containing many formulas, divided into three parts and with a lengthy half title summarizing the content: "Avertissement: Pour mettre quelque ordre dans ce recueil, nous le diviserons en trois parties. La premiere contiendra des secrets et recettes qui ont pour objet la Santé. la Seconde en fera connaître qui ont rapport à l'utilité. La troisieme enfin traitera d'un grand nombree qui ont pour objet l'agrément, l'ornement". The second and third parts are dealing with dyeing, bleaching, gilt-coating, many formulas for the manufacturing of paints, inks and varnishes in some instances with detailed instructions how to appply them on various commodities, spot removing, paragraphs on pastel and colourful fire-works, and many more. A fine copy.



"Auer von Welsbach hatte seit 1856 Versuche zur Herstellung von Papier aus Maisstroh durchführen lassen ... 1862 erhält er auf sein neues Verfahren ein Patent. Ein Teil des Kataloges der Londoner Weltausstellung von 1862 wird auf das erste Maisstrohpapier von Auer gedruckt." (Weiss. Zeittafel zur Papiergeschichte p. 345). In addition to this important paperhistorical fact, the catalogue is also of great interest for other reasons, as it contains numerous contributions by the editor as well as essays by important scientists and technicians. Peter Tunner on metallurgy; Ferdinand Kohn on tools and sewing machines; Franz Pisko on scientific



instruments and education; Franz von Wertheim on steel commodities; and Victor von Lang on photography among others. Provenance: Preliminary page with autograph dedication by Ferdinand von Friedland (1810-1868), Austria's delegate at the Stockholm Exposition of 1866, for a member of the Fahnehjelm family. Friedland was a member of the jury in Classe 33 (jewellery).



A very nice copy of a scarce trade catalogue by a German paper manufacturer who is also offering various printing services to his customers for advertising purposes, like the manufacturing of clichés and vignettes, using chemigraphical and stereotypographical and other printing processes. All pouches are illustrated with examples of sale promotions. A remarkably well preserved copy.







"Thomas de la Rue (1793-1866) was born in a small hamlet in Guernsey called Le Bourg in 1793. At the age of ten he was apprenticed to his brother-in-law Joseph Antoine Chevalier, a master printer in St Peter Port who produced the Gazette de l'Île de Guernsey, the first printed newspaper on the island. During this period Thomas gained a thorough knowledge of printing. In 1818 he moved to London with his family and set up shop initially as a straw hat manufacturer, but he soon diversified into bookbinding and the embossing of leather, and then into paper manufacture. By around 1828 his interests had moved to playing cards and he began to put everything he had learnt into practice. De la Rue introduced letter-press printing and certain other improvements (quicker drying coloured inks, improved glazing technology and the use of enamelled paper) into playing card production and was granted a patent in 1831. He produced his first playing cards in 1832 and over the years came to be recognised as the inventor of the modern English playing card. In 1844 Thomas de la Rue employed the graphic designer Owen Jones who in the ensuing 20 years produced 173 outstanding back designs for De la Rue ranging from fruit-and-flower themes to Chinese and Arabesque. Owen Jones also designed playing card backs for Lawrence & Cohen (USA) and his designs were imitated by other manufacturers. From 1840 until 1856 playing cards remained the firm's chief money maker and this provided a financial basis for any new fields of activity that De la Rue wished to enter. Thomas de la Rue became known as 'the father of the English playing card" (www.wopc.co.uk/delarue/index).

Under various owners and names the De La Rue plc still exists today as a British company headquartered in Basingstoke, which manufactures polymer and security printed products including banknotes and tax stamps. 



Opulently designed commemorative publication with high-quality printed material by the Berlin printing company Otto Elsner, published on the occasion of the company's 33rd anniversary. This commemorative publication, produced only in a small but unspecified edition, is probably the most elaborate and highest-quality advertising publication in the history of the German printing trade. The introduction and company history which cover the first 16 pages are followed by 12 cardboard sheets with mostly mounted multi-coloured illustrated advertising material, including a cover illustration with black print after a lineetched hand drawing, and text design by prof. Peter Behrens; a recommendation print work for shipping companies with illustrations after line-etched hand drawings, text design by prof. Fritz Helmuth Ehmcke; a pictorial leaflet in polychrome for the cruising company Hapag-Lloyd ; an advertising leaflet for art and fashion products in rotogravure; a printed leaflet with envelope for large technical companies in colours, among others. - The commercial artist and book designer W. F. Deffke (1887-1950) worked in Peter Behrens' graphic art studio from 1909 to 1910 where he also met Walter Gropius and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe. From 1912 to 1914, Deffke together with Carl Ernst Hinkefuß had been active on the artistic advisory board of the Elsner print shop. In 1916, Deffke and Hinkefuß founded the advertising studio Wilhelmwerk -Pflegestätte Deutscher Werkkunst and in 1918 they published the programmatic work "Handelsmarken und Fabrikzeichen", in which they emphasised the importance of a modern type of trade mark and thus belonged to the avantgarde of the modernist "new typography" movement.

It is certain therefore, it was of English manufacture and in all probability it came from the establishment of one of the leading paper-stainers of the period; as good a guess as any would be Bromwich, of Ludgate Hill, or Spinnage, of Cockspur Street, London" (Sugden, A. V. and L. Edmondson; History of English Wallpaper p. 69). According to the V & A description, similar patterns survive in a number of American houses. This particular design has been reproduced specifically for the refurbishment of an historic house museum – Gunston Hall, Lorton in Virginia – where it has been hung in the entrance hall.



Located in the municipal area of Payerbach the former paper mill "Schlöglmühl" in Schmidsdorf, was of great economic importance for the entire region. Until 1781 it was a grist and saw mill, then a lard or mirror factory, and in 1851/52 it was converted into a paper mill to meet the paper requirements of the state printing office K. K. Hof- und Staatsdruckerei in Vienna. A large part of the paper for the banknotes, securities or stamps of the Habsburg monarchy was produced in the "Schlöglmühl". It was not only one of the largest paper mills in the Austro-Hungarian Empire, but also an innovative one which implemented groundbreaking technologies, like the manufacture of continuous paper. Under the direction of Alois Auer industrial research was carried out on various substances (corn fibre among others) to substitute rags for the manufacture of paper, which led to the 1863 publication of the report on the 1862 World's Fair in London, entirely printed on corn fibre paper. In 1982 the business was closed down.







Wilhelm Gropius (1793-1870), a German painter born in Brunswick had lived in Berlin since 1802. His artistic training started in a straw hat and flower factory where he had to colour the flowers. An important moment in his artistic career was the encounter with Karl Friedrich Schinkel. The latter trained him as a landscape painter and employed him in his studio for the design of stage decorations. Gropius devoted himself to decorative painting and worked as a court theatre painter from 1819 in his own studio and in 1820, he was appointed to royal theatre inspector of Berlin, in charge of the building and design of stage decorations. In 1822 Gropius was elected a member of the Prussian Academy of Arts. During one of his travels in Europe he became acquainted with the diorama invented by Louis Daguerre and Charles Marie Bouton in Paris. In 1827 he opened a diorama in Berlin together with his brothers where he displayed his own landscape paintings made on his travels and panoramas showing events of the time, such as the great fire in Moscow 1812 and the great fire in Hamburg in 1842. In the same year he had started a publishing house, a painting gallery and an art shop adjacent to the diorama.

In 1836 he established a factory producing Steinpappe ("stone cardboard"), which was basically papier maché strengthened with glue and precipitated chalk. This results in a stonelike consistency that took gilding well and was extremely easy to shape and cut, and was thus ideal for Gropius' stage settings. All designs in this catalog are by Gropius himself and intented as mentioned on the title for architects, interior decorators and workmen in the building trade. 

Léon joined his mother's business in the early 1860s, and around 1875 he became an associate owner of the business together with his half-brother Edmond Engelmann who was in charge of the printing and publishing department. They moved with the business in 1878 to a new address in Paris: 418 rue Saint-Honoré, a shop and a workshop. Léon quickly developed his own style in bookbinding and became sole owner of the workshop in January 1891, on the death of his



half-brother Edmond. Α number of the booklabels seem to be much earlier, one is dated 1881 others wich are undated could be dated earlier because of their numbering, some of the specimens bearing numbers below 10000 whereas the majority bears numbers 50000. above Included are booklabels for the American female great collector Grace Whitney Hoff,

decoration as well as for technical applications in production processes with examples of moiré metallic paper, tracing paper, marbled paper, coloured glossy paper, satin paper, gold or silver paper with velvety patterns, waterproof paper (including a fabric for ladies' hats invented by Dessaux at no. 152 rue de la Mortellerie in Paris), English rosewood paper, English pink cotton paper, morocco imitation paper, rolled cardboard for making ladies' hats, as well as various paper samples made from other raw materials than rags (corn and wood among others). Furthermore, with specimen samples of visiting cards on coloured woven papers (12 specimens), samples of parchment papers by François Montgolfier (11 samples), a Chinese-style paper made by Montgolfier with a printed colour proof (proof wrapper for an 1825 edition of the History of the Royal House of Bourbon by Achaintre), and a paper made in Edinburgh


for sealing and polishing iron. In addition, precious sample specimens of exotic papers from the Philippine Islands, Tonkin, Tibet, the Sunda Islands, Cochinchina, two beautiful samples of fabrics from the inhabitants of Malabar, a leaf extracted from a real Chinese manuscript given by Mr. Nepveu and brought from China by the Jesuit missionaries, as well as a curious fragment of paper made with raw Turkish wheat leaves bleached with chloride.

The address on the title refers to an outlet stationery shop of the papermill Ancienne Fabrique Royale Montgolfier D'Annonay in Paris as evidenced by a number of trade cards in various colours which are included in the album. The other address on the morocco title shield is probably the private one of Alexandre de Montgolfier.

A facinating and valuable collection offering a wide panorama on the art of paper from the beginnings of printing to the latest innovations of the first third of the 19th century. One specimen preserved only in fragments, a few specimens removed, some with tears and tiny pieces missing. It once belonged to Alexandre Jacques Montgolfier (1803-1866), in all likelihood compiled by himself, who was a paper manufacturer at the papermill in Davezieux (Ardèche), and a descendant of the famous paper making dynasty, and a grandson of Jean-Pierre de Montgolfier who was a brother of Étienne and Joseph de Montgolfier, famous for their aeronautical experiments with balloons.

Piette, a paper manufacturer and author of numerous monographs



and articles in journals on papermaking, took over his father's paper mill in Dillingen in 1827 and acquired another paper mill in Arlon in Luxembourg in 1853. He was the founder and editor of the trade magazine "Journal des fabricants de papier" from 1854 until his death in 1862. Maria Ludwig Valentin Piette, called Louis, and his brother Prosper Joseph Maria Piette, introduced for the first time in paper history the boiling of rags in lime and potash instead of digestion. In 1838 they invented the ball boiler and obtained a Prussian patent for an improved knot catcher in 1848. Finally they developed their own processes for sizing the pulp in the vat. In the 1850s, they produced the best paper in German speaking countries. Far more important than these inventions, however, were the experiments Louis Piette carried out in his paper mill in Dillingen. He searched for new raw materials for paper production as well as new ways of pulping and bleaching them. His greatest merit, however, lies in his publishing activities. Far more openly than any other colleague, Louis Piette reported freely on his experiments and published them with countless attached paper samples and material specimens.





Regensburg natural scientist Jacob Christian Schäffer (1718-1790). In his search for a machine that could be suitable for his paper experiments as a replacement for the Hollander beater used in paper mills at that time, Schäffer came across the description of a washing machine by Gotthard Friedrich Stender, which had been imported from England to Hanover and Brunswick. Inspired by this, Schäffer had such a machine made on the basis of this description and carried out tests. Based on his test experiences, some modifications were made. He published these experiences and the design of the washing machine for households in 1766 "Die bequeme und höchstvortheilhafte Waschmaschine". The machine is said to have been made in around 60 copies; a replica of Schäffer's washing machine is exhibited in the Miele Museum in Gütersloh in Germany.

The pastor and important Thuringian pomologist Johann Volkmar Sickler (1742-1820) replicated this washing machine for his second wife, and improved and developed it further to make the hard work of doing the laundry easier for women.

The majority of labels in this album don't have stamped

or printed names, but images related to the exotic origin of the tobacco, its qualities, names of tobacco sorts and sometimes images which one would not necessarily relate to tobacco (a caricature of Napoleon, portraits of European notability, a steam engine, military, and topgraphical views among many others).

A fascinating compilation of tobacco related imagery for publicity purposes, probably put together by the firm of Gebrüder Hugo. List of businesses comprises: Hugo Gebrüder Lahr/Amsterdam; Becker & Zoon Amsterdam; W & W Amsterdam; Thorbecke & Comp. Zwolle; Cornelis Kuyper, Amsterdam; Johannes Jotzselaar, Amsterdam; Frans van de Velde & Zoonen, Amsterdam; P. H. V. Poggemann, Amsterdam; Gebroeder Noordzink, Amsterdam; Herman Oldenkott en Zoonen, Amsterdam; J. F. D. Eberstein, Amsterdam; Tabac Becker & Zoon, Amsterdam; Willem Steyn, Amsterdam; A. D. Reuver, Amsterdam; De Jager, Amsterdam; and Scafferlaty, Paris. "Tobacco was among the first commodities to be sold in printed paper wrappers. ... The design element of tobacco papers was normally confined to the centre of the printed sheet, which was large enough to accommodate varying quantities of tobacco. The



earliest designs were in the tradition of the bookplate, but later they took on the characteristics of the trade card and were often printed from plates actually designed as trade cards. Engraved pictorial designs were common in Germany, Holland and France. ... The simple tobacco paper was superseded by the tobacco wrapper when the manufacturer took over the role of packager from the shopkeeper" (Rickards pp. 329-330). One leaf damaged, a few leaves with thump marks in lower right corner, light foxing in a few places else in excellent condition. A rare survivor.

Not in IBP. Very rare ephemeral booklet. KVK shows only a reprint of the original edition published in 1988 at the German National Library in Leipzig, and only one other copy of the original edition traceable for me in the hygienic museum "Klo & So" in the Austrian town of Gmunden.

A curious advertising ephemera by the publisher and luxury paper manufacturer Adolf Sala in Berlin; printed in Aschersleben, it's probable that it was made to order by the large-scale paper manufacturer H. C. Bestehorn in Aschersleben. The illustrations show people from all walks of life doing the "big business", both at home and outdoors. The humorous verses sing the song of the delightful bowel movement, "An open heart is highly honored, but an open body is also worth something"; a beautiful young lady is even shown in the study of a love letter on the toilet: "Follow the call of nature - on the rose's love track" and "In the golden harmony - mix golden melody". Staples rusty and a few leaves loose. — The satirical and funny publisher's address to the public at the end of the book is quite noteworthy: "Es ist keine







The printer is the Montargois Claude Lequatre, held at discretion for being severely convicted in 1777 in a case of seditious libels. A famous provincial printing, published in only a very small number.

"Ainsi pour les Œuvres du marquis de Villette (...) leur nombre ne peut dépasser, croyons-nous, vingt exemplaires en tout pour les papiers teints de différentes couleurs, et une dizaine pour les papiers botaniques" (Anne Basanoff. Le Papier botanique, in: Revue Francaise d'Histoire du Livre, no 14, 1977, p. 117).

Our copy is one of the approximately 10 copies printed on marshmallow paper, approximately 10 other copies were printed on linden bark paper and an indeterminate number of about 20 copies printed on variously tinted papers. Each sample has its name printed on recto: Papier d'ortie, de houblon, de mousse, de roseaux, de conferva (première, deuxième et troisième espèces), de racines de chiendent, de bois de fusain, de bois de coudrier, d'écorces d'orme, de tilleul, d'osier, de marsaut, de saule, de peuplier, de chêne, de


feuilles de bardane, de bardane et de pas-d'ane, de chardons. The book was published on the initiative of Pierre Alexandre Léorier Delisle (1774-1826) who created in 1784 a paper factory in Bûges, after having directed that of Langlée (Loiret). Delisle died ruined after having enriched himself under the Revolution in the manufacture of assignats. He signed the dedication in which he summarizes his work "J'ai soumis à la fabrication du papier toutes les plantes, les écorces & les végétaux les plus communs. Les échantillons qui sont à la fin de ce volume ne sont que des extraits de mes expériences. J'ai voulu prouver qu'on pouvait substituer aux matières ordinaires du papier, qui deviennent chaque jour plus rares, d'autres matières les plus inutiles."

He submitted his procedures to the Academy of Sciences, trying to put in a claim directed against the German Jacob Christian Schaeffer who published his "Versuche und Muster ohne alle Lumpen oder doch mit einem geringen Zusatze Papier zu machen" Regensburg, 1765 to 1772 with numerous samples but Schäffer's specimens were fabricated with an admixture of linen and cotton rags. Three samples with traces of worming, half-title and title cut short in lower margin without touching printed area. An excellent copy, all edges uncut, bound in a richly decorated contemporary French red morocco binding.






making. Last but not least there are chapters on writing utensils, tints, sealing waxes, the art of illumination, and the history of book collecting. The book closes with a description of book parasites and pest control. Front fly-leaf with contemporary manuscript notes and ownership entry.

A beautiful catalog by the firm of Henry Théodore Théophile Bouquillard, a lithographer and letterpress printer (active c 1840-1873), however the centre of his business activities in the 1840s was his specialisation in stationery. In an advertisement in the 1847 "Annuaire du Commerce", he pointed out his ability to print on different papers, including a "very strong and supple muslin paper" which made it possible to print a large amount of text in a very thin and light volume. In 1840 his business was located at the above mentioned address 226, rue St. Martin in Paris. One sample specimen removed and obviously a few sheets cut-out. Still a remarkable tour-de-force of colourfully printed paper specimens, some of them abundantly adorned with fake pearls and hair jewellery, gilt rings, bracelets and necklaces and other trimmings.

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
